Field guide to plant families of North America using the method of patterns of plant identification.

- Judd, Walter S., Christopher S. Campbell, Elizabeth A. Kellogg, Peter f. Stevens, and Michael J. Donoghue. 2008. Plant Systematics-A Phylogenetic Approach (3rd Edition). Sinauer Associates, Inc.; Sunderland, Massachusetts. 611 pp.

The latest book out on new thoughts of how families are related based on current research results from molecular biology. A very thorough book used by many as a textbook for teaching.

This is the bible for the beginning of the Binomial System of plant classification.

- Neal, Bill. 1992. Gardener's Latin. Algonquin Books of Chapel Hill, N.C. 136 pp.

A type of dictionary for pronunciation and explanation of specific epithets.

- Smith, James Payne, Jr. 1977. Vascular Plant Families. Mad River Press, Inc.; Eureka, California. 320 pp.

Plant families described with line drawings, summary of specific identifying characteristics, and floral formulae.

- Stern, William T. 1992. Botanical Latin (4th Edition). Published in North America in 1995 by Timber Press, Inc.; Portland, Oregon. 546 pp.

A great book that summarizes the grammar and syntax of botanical Latin. Covers the roots and origins of Latin and latinized terms for anyone who has never taken Latin.
